

Mosaic Futures

Mosaic Futures, our primary school mentoring programme, provides a unique programme that aims to raise aspirations of young Muslim girls and to help empower their mothers so that they are better able to support their daughters fulfil their potential.



Objectives

The programme seeks to equip young girls with the skills to connect education to work at an early age through female mentors from professional backgrounds acting as role models, so that girls can aspire to careers in a range of different sectors. Mothers participate in lessons that teach them the importance of education and how to support their daughters through school and beyond.

The Programme

The programme itself is 8 hour long sessions where girls cover themes such as confidence, communication and role models, whilst mothers discuss relevant themes such as citizenship and understanding the British education system. Sessions take place weekly but can vary according to the schools schedule.



To complement sessions and themes covered, Mothers and Daughters are provided with resource booklets which they can refer to throughout the course and beyond.

Cost

As with all of Mosaic's services to schools, participation in the programme is free of cost. However, schools will be asked to meet the cost of travel for off-site visits.

University Visit

Included in the programme is a special university visit to provide exposure to further education. Hosted by student ambassadors, Mothers and Daughters attend a prominent university to participate in workshops, a tour of the campus and a presentation on university life.



Graduation Ceremony

To celebrate completion of Mosaic Futures, Mothers and Daughters are invited to attend a special graduation ceremony to recognise their achievement. The graduation is attended by high-profile speaker from Mosaic's speakers' bureau and showcases the experiences of Mothers, Daughters and mentors from the programme.



Mentors

Mosaic's female mentors complement the programme giving insights into their personal and professional lives whilst helping to facilitate the lessons run by teachers. Bringing the project to life, Mentors provide examples of balancing work with family, what it means to be a good citizen, and the role of women in society. Mentors are often from a wide range of organisations and in the past have included civil servants, life coaches, senior directors, academics and senior lawyers.



Becoming a Mosaic Primary School

In addition to participation in the programmes above, schools will have access to further opportunities arising from Mosaic's core initiatives. These include extended engagements with Mosaic mentors, high-profile individuals from Mosaic's Speakers Bureau, inspirational visits to work places and creative workshops through the Mosaic Media Network.
